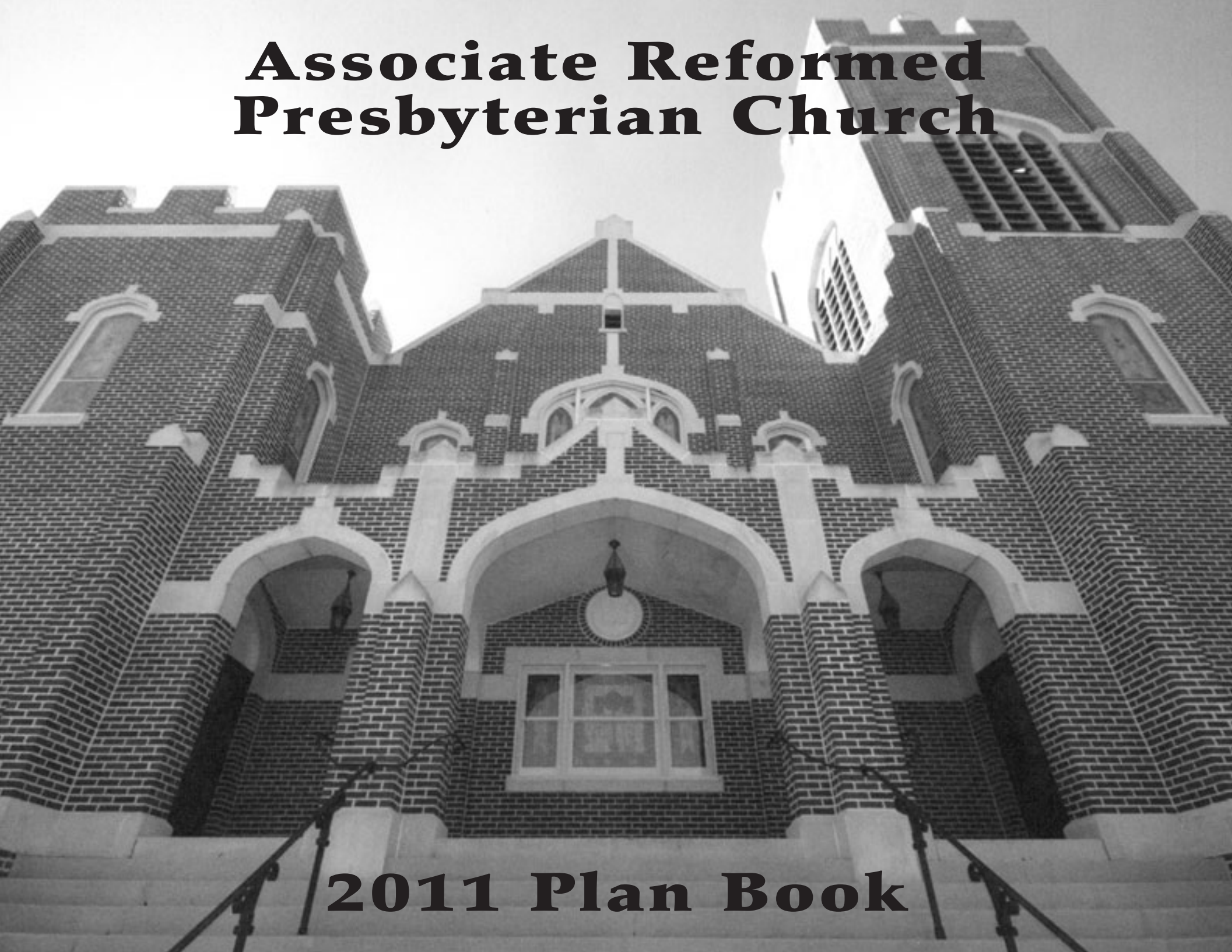

A BRIEF HISTORICAL SKETCH OF THE BARTOW ASSOCIATE REFORMED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

The Bartow A.R.P. Church was organized under the auspices of the Second Presbytery by the Reverend C. S. Young on January 12, 1890. Our church has grown from 15 charter members to a congregation of family members today numbering more than 500.

Our first building was begun in 1892 at the cost of \$4,500. Of this amount, \$1,000 was contributed by the Synod and the remainder from local contributions.

The erection of the present building was begun in 1925. Upon completion of construction, it was dedicated "to the glory of God" on June 20, 1926. At that time, the number of members reported to Synod was 156.

In 1973 we completed a modernization program of our entire church building at which time the number of members was 293.

Then in 1985, we completed our new building addition which includes an elevator, a fellowship hall, kitchen, choir room, young people's meeting rooms, conference room/library, and an office suite.

We honored our 103rd birthday by naming this fellowship hall in memory of Dr. Grady R. Oates.

DENOMINATION SHORT TERM MISSIONS 2011

A short-term mission trip is a great opportunity for
Christians to assist in the work of missions and to grow in
their understanding of evangelism, discipleship and ser-
vice. We have needs for people in Mexico, Germany, Spain
and Wales.

January-March: Construction or evangelistic trips to
Rio Verde, San Luis Potosi, and Valles, Mexico.

March-April: Spring break trips for high school and
college groups — groups can do youth outreach programs
in Wales, or do construction and evangelism in Mexico.

June: College students are invited to participate in a two
month internship program in Wales where they minister to
children and youth. Any church group is also invited to
minister in Mexico through VBS, evangelistic ministries,
or construction projects.

July: Annual Wales Mission — do VBS, youth out-

MUSIC DEPARTMENT

The Music Department of our church includes the following choirs: Adult Choir, Youth Choir, Junior Choir and Beginner's Choir.

The **Adult Choir** rehearses on Wednesday nights, following the Bible Study, and sings an anthem and choral responses each Sabbath. Practices are cancelled during summer months, when anthems are generally limited to solos and small ensembles.

Special Christmas and Easter Cantatas are presented each year, and special music is prepared for the Mission and Spiritual Life Conference.

The **Youth Choir** consists of Jr./Sr. High students who participate in the Christmas Pageant, Youth Sabbath, and occasionally for other events.

The **Junior Choir** and **Beginner's Choir** meet each Sabbath Night, consisting of elementary and pre-school students, respectively. These choirs participate in Youth Sabbath, the Christmas Pageant, and special services and programs. The Junior Choir also presents a Spring Musical each year.

ERSKINE COLLEGE

Since the founding of Erskine College as South Carolina's first four-year denominational college, the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church has held a distinguished role in higher education. As Erskine College entered the 1990s under a new president, Dr. James W. Strobel, it began implementation of a Strategic Plan prepared by more than 200 persons from every constituency of the college and guided by "The Philosophy of Christian Higher Education" of the ARP Church.

In 1998, Dr. Strobel was succeeded by Dr. John L. Carson, 1967 graduate of Erskine and a Kennedy Scholar. In 2005, Dr. Luder Whitlock became Interim President. Presently, Dr. Randy Ruble is President.

Erskine remains committed to the building of "total men and women," intellectual, spiritual, and physical, who will provide the Christian leadership needed by the nation and the world.

"KICK-OFF" FOR YOUTH ACTIVITIES

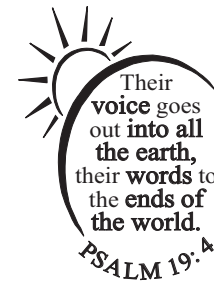

BIBLE SABBATH

The American Bible Society has, for decades, distributed the Holy Bible (and portions thereof) within the United States. The purpose of the Society is to “provide the Holy Scriptures to every man, woman, and child in a language and form each can readily understand, and at a price each can easily afford.”

The American Bible Society joins the United Bible Societies for international distribution of the Scriptures. The Society is engaged in a massive translation effort, for there are still millions worldwide who do not have a Gospel in their own language. It is also significant that the distribution of the Scripture is made without doctrinal note or comment and without profit.

Recently, 8,200 copies of the Serbian Bible were sent to Belgrade. 17,000 Albanian New Testaments and 14,000 Gospels of Matthew in Albanian have been sent to that country which, 26 years ago, closed all 2,169 churches and mosques within its borders. The American Bible Society has been supported by the ARP denomination for years.

A.R.P. MAGAZINE SUBSCRIPTION CAMPAIGN

This month we emphasize the effort of “ARP agents” in local congregations to promote and encourage subscriptions to *The ARP Magazine*, our denomination’s monthly magazine. *The ARP* is the official periodical of our church. Its goals are to help ARPs become more mature Christians, better informed church members and more dynamic persons in the home and workplace. It is the primary channel of communication for the members, agencies and organizations of the church. Our church subscribes for each of our families.

THE SESSION

As in the Old Testament Church, under the law, there were elders of the people for the purpose of government. Similarly, in the New Testament Christian Church, under the apostles, there were elders who also ruled.

To this office should be chosen men sound in the faith, of godly life, and whose natural gifts of wisdom and discretion fit them for ruling. The elder should be a man of outstanding ability, courage to think for himself, and by all means, a man of prayer, since he is responsible to God for the precious human souls under his care.

The elder in his ordination vows promises, in humble reliance upon God’s grace, to discharge diligently the duties of his office, to be faithful and impartial in the exercise of Discipline, and to be faithful in attending the meetings of the Session, the Presbytery and the General Synod.

Each elder of our church is assigned a proportionate number of the membership as his shepherding group to which he ministers in the various phases of our church.

The Session meets at 6:00 p.m. on Monday following the third Sabbath of each month, as well as following the morning worship service to receive new members. A prayer meeting is held the first Monday at 6:00 p.m. Quarterly meetings are also scheduled with the Deacons.

CHRISTMAS SHOEBOXES

“Operation Christmas Child” brings joy and hope to children in desperate situations around the world through gift-filled shoeboxes and the Good News of God’s love. This program of Samaritan’s Purse provides an opportunity for people of all ages to be involved in a simple “hands-on” missions project while focusing on the true meaning of Christmas — Jesus Christ, God’s greatest gift. We wish to have as many members as possible to contribute Christmas “shoeboxes” packed with wonderful surprises for children of specific ages for this ministry.

GUIDE FOR DENOMINATION MINISTRY FUNDING 2011

Special Offerings, ARP Women’s Ministries, Investment Income, Gifts and Program Fees, Direct Support, Fees and Services, Denominational Ministry Funds—these are the financial resources for denominational ministry.

In early September our church will receive a “Guide” designed to assist us in the process of planning the causes toward which the unrestricted tithes and offerings of our congregation shall be directed. We will be encouraged to commit, on a voluntary basis, a portion (percentage) of the anticipated unrestricted tithes and offerings as Denominational Ministry Funds to the General Synod for allocation to denominational agencies. Specifically, the session will be asked to commit to:

- Review the manner in which denominational ministries are funded; and
- The consideration of meeting the goal for Denominational Ministry funding. As currently stated the goal is for each church to:
 - maintain its current level of support if giving 20% or more of its unrestricted tithes and offerings; or
 - if currently giving less than 20%, to increase giving by 1 percentage point each year until the 20% level is reached.

The Board of Stewardship continues in its efforts to provide churches with the support and tools necessary in encouraging the practice of total stewardship, both in the congregation and among the congregations. DEACONS

Four deacons are elected each year to serve a three-year term, thus maintaining a board of twelve deacons. The authority of this office is found in the example and teachings of the apostles. Before election, a deacon should prove himself to be a faithful member of the church, of sober and godly life and of good report, and fitted by sound judgment for the duties of this office.

The office of deacon has much to do with the growth and spiritual welfare of the church, as he must manage all the temporal affairs of the church. The Board of Deacons must collect and disburse the various church funds, care for the church buildings and property, and manage all business affairs of the church.

The deacons meet for a 6:30 p.m. on the Monday following the second Sabbath of each month, and have a joint quarterly meeting with the Elders.

One of the major responsibilities each year is to provide for and plan the Thanksgiving Season of Commitment. The ultimate goal of this occasion is to inspire the entire congregation to express its commitment financially to the welfare of our church and all of its programs, and through the Grace of God, we have been blessed with a responsible and highly committed church congregation.

SEASON OF COMMITMENT

During this season, we will have the opportunity to participate in the budget plans for the year and the opportunity to make our financial stewardship responses. There will be special events provided by the Deacons seeking the participation of every member as we celebrate the season of thankfulness while reviewing and renewing our commitments to the financial needs and responsibilities of our church.
